Types of RV

Class A Motorhome

SIZE: 21-40 ft
COSTS: From \$60,000 to \$500,000+
SLEEPS: Up to 6



Class B Motorhomes

SIZE: 16-22 ft
COSTS: From \$60,000 to \$130,000
SLEEPS: Up to 4

Travel Trailers are easily the most popular of all camping units. A small one can be pulled by a VW Beetle, and some of the largest may need a one ton pickup. Variety and floor plans are unlimited. Great for families or for two that need an extra vehicle to get around.

5th Wheel trailers have a split-level design that creates separate living spaces and added privacy. Kitchen islands and fireplaces are found in most models. By design, the 5th wheel has a hitch that can only be pulled by a pickup and offers better maneuverability than the travel trailer. Some may have two separate bathrooms.

Whether you are a seasoned camper, or are just starting out, there is the perfect RV for you. **Class A** motorhomes are fabulous for long distance due to the spacious interior and comfort. Many snowbirds have Class A motorhomes, due to features like full-size appliances, king beds, washer/dryers, and walk-in closets.

Class B motorhomes are perfect for two people and are easily maneuvered in parking lots and congested streets. Of course, if you don't need space and really only need a bed, a Class B may be just for you. Ceiling height could be an issue.

Class C motorhomes are known for their affordability and ease of Ford/ Chevy engine maintenance. Women think it's easier to drive. They have almost the same amenities as the Class A, just a little less space. The overhead bunk is great for grandchildren.

COSTS: From \$43,000 to \$200,000+
SLEEPS: Up to 8



Travel Trailer

SIZE: 12-35 ft
COSTS: From \$8,000 to \$95,000
SLEEPS: Up to 10



Popup Trailer

SIZE: 8-24 ft
COSTS: From \$6,000 to \$22,000
SLEEPS: Up to 8

Fifth Wheel

SIZE: 21-40 ft
COSTS: From \$18,000 to \$160,000
SLEEPS: Up to 6



Truck Camper

SIZE: 8-20 ft
COSTS: From \$6,000 to \$55,000
SLEEPS: Up to 6





Popup Trailers are useful to those that only have a car to tow it. They are very lightweight, easy to pull, easy to set up, and can sleep four comfortably. Space is limited.

Truck Campers can have up to three slide-outs to increase space. The overhead bunk is spacious. The biggest benefit is that you can tow a boat or motorcycle, etc. and drop the camper at your site, truck available.

When: APRIL 27 - 30, 2023

DIRECTIONS: Travel south on Hwy 101 south of Lincoln City to MP 119 (1/2 mile south of Schooner Creek). Turn left on S Drift Creek Road for 1 ½ miles, right at T in the road to the park. **(Do not follow your GPS!)**

Cost: Camping fees per Rig per day **\$40**; Rally fees **\$30 per person**, which entitles you to all meals and activities. Meals will be prepared by Chapter members with sign-up sheets for volunteers. Meals included: Breakfast all three days; Thursday evening - ice cream social; Friday Dinner: Lasagna; Saturday Dinner: Fried Chicken and Mashed potatoes/gravy. Johnny Apple Seed Oatmeal

Prep Time: 2 minutes Cook Time: 10 minutes Total Time: 12 minutes

Makes 2 bowls

Ingredients:

2 cups water

pinch salt

1 cup rolled oats

1 medium apple, diced into 1/2 cubes

½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg

¼ teaspoon ground cloves

¼ teaspoon allspice

2 tablespoons hemp, flax, or chia seeds (or a blend of equal parts hemp, flax, and chia)

2 tablespoons maple syrup

Instructions:

Heat the water and salt in a medium pot until it comes to a boil.

Add the oats, simmer for about ten minutes, or until the oats are tender, stirring occasionally. Halfway through the cooking time, add the apple, spices, seeds, and maple syrup.



IN MEMORIAM

We are sincerely heartbroken to share that Bob Simons, beloved friend, and mentor, has passed away. Bob will always be remembered as a fun-loving and irreplaceable family member of Oregon Good Sam and ORCA.



Bob was born in Portland, OR on May 5, 1944, and passed to his next caravan on January 7, 2023, in Longview, WA of cancer of the lungs.

He and Judy were charter members of Bridgetown Campers in 2006, serving as president, vice-president, secretary, and newsletter editor positions. In 2009 he was appointed to become Westerners assistant state director to follow George Vennes. He served in this capacity until 2022 when illness asked him to retire. He, Judy, and Sally Hancock effectively choreographed the Westerners Roundup for 11 years and had such a great time meeting and greeting all those who chose to participate in the fun with him.

Bob was a 28-year retired military veteran serving first on the USS Nautilus, the first nuclear powered submarine, and then transferring to the US Coast Guard Reserve. He will be laid to rest at Willamette National Cemetery.

He leaves behind tail-gunner Judy, two sons Ken and Jeff, and one granddaughter, Emily.

We are sad to share the passing of faithful friends Bob and Marge Matthews.

Bob was born March 3, 1931, and passed away in Salem, Oregon, on November 15, 2022. Marge was born May 7, 1934 and passed away in Parker, Colorado, on December 16, 2022.

Bob's death was somewhat expected, and he had been in hospice for many months. Marge was able to move to her nephew Jeff Toborg's home location. Recent tests revealed a malignant mass in her liver. She was placed on hospice just four days before her passing. They will be missed every day!

Bob and Marge made tours to different locations in the late 1980s and 1990s and attended meetings in Rickreall. They were also much involved in Samboree activities at Madras. Bob and Marge were members of the Jolly Wheelers.

Wayne and Mary Swanson purchased Bob & Marge's home when they went into assisted living homes.
