Sometimes indoor activities in an RV can be just as much fun as being outdoors; get out the games, jigsaw puzzles and popcorn! However, a pair of rubber boots and an umbrella should be "must-haves" in your RV. Take a walk in the rain and stomp in those puddles like a kid and enjoy a camping trip soon!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING EIN AND BUSINESS REGISTRY FOR CHAPTERS - PLEASE READ !!

Many of you have been inquiring about EIN numbers and Business Registry. I have been in contact with the Oregon Secretary of State's Office, and the Oregon Department of Justice to confirm our requirements as an organization and as chapters. Every organization must have an employer identification number (EIN), even if it will not have employees. The EIN is a unique number that identifies the organization to the Internal Revenue Service and banks require it now days, especially if you have changed your chapter name and are opening new accounts. It is easily applied for online through the IRS and is free. Either chapter presidents or secretaries should apply for this at <https://www.irs-ein-tax-id.com>. According to the IRS, the person applying for the EIN must be a "responsible and duly authorized member or officer of the exempt organization." That person will use their personal information and social security number for the application. Once the EIN is established, the personal social security number will no longer be needed or used for anything. Besides their social security number, the person applying for the EIN will need to have our organization's legal name and both the mailing address and the physical address of our organization:

Legal Name: Oregon RV Campers Association

Mailing address: PO Box 434, Estacada, OR 97023

Physical address: 19319 SE Hwy 224, Damascus, OR 97089

Other information you'll need: We are classified as a non-profit 501(c)(7) social/recreation club. Starting date of ORCA is January 1, 2023, and the closing month of our accounting year is December.

Because of our tax exempt and non-profit status (and provided your chapters' gross income doesn't exceed \$50,000 per year) each chapter will be required to file a simple, IRS 990-N e-Postcard that is submitted electronically; there are **no paper forms**.

Form 990-N is due **every year by the 15th day of the 5th month** after the close of our tax year. **You cannot file the e-Postcard until after our tax year ends.**

Example: Our tax year ends on December 31, so the e-Postcard is due May 15 of the following year. If the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday, the due date is the next business day. (**Instructions for Form 990-N are found on the IRS website. If you need help, please consult your State Director.**)

Late Submissions: If the IRS doesn't receive your submission by the due date, a reminder will be sent to the address on file (this is why personal information is required to obtain an EIN). The organization and chapters should submit the required form, even if they are late. There is no penalty for late submissions.

While there is no penalty assessment for filing Form 990-N late, organizations that fail to file the required Form 990-N for three consecutive years will automatically lose their tax-exempt status. Revocation of the organization's tax-exempt status will happen on the filing due date of the third consecutively-missed year.

Only ORCA is required to be registered with the State of Oregon. **Chapters DO NOT need to register.**

The ladies of ORCA are again invited to bring their sewing machine, supplies and cut fabric to make quilts for the charity of their choice. The sewing room will be open all day, every day of the rally. We are offering a pattern here, or you can bring one of your own choice. Come in and sew on your own time!

Quilts of Hope NICU Quilt Small (38x38)

Fabric Requirements:

3/8 yard Fabric A; Cut into (3) 3 1/2" strips WOF

3/8 yard Fabric B; Cut into (3) 3 1/2" strips WOF


3/8 yard Fabric C; Cut into (12) 6 1/2" squares

1/4 yard Inner Border; Cut into (4) 1 1/2" strips WOF (1/6 yard will work)

1/2 yard Outer Border; Cut into (4) 3 1/2" strips WOF

* All measurements use 1/4 inch seam allowances.


* Fabric cutting directions are for fabrics that are 42 inches wide.



Before starting, please see the Quilts of Hope guidelines on the back for thread, fabric, and other requirements.

Assembling the Blocks:

1. Using one strip A and one strip B, sew together WOF. Make (3) sets. Press seams toward the darker fabric.



2. Cut the strips into 3 1/2" by 6 1/2" blocks to create 26 A/B blocks.

There will be extra fabric by cutting the 3 strips of 42" fabric, only 26 blocks are needed.

Cutting three strips allows for differences in fabric width.



3. Sew units of two blocks together to form a 4-patch. Make (13) 4-patch sets.



Assembling the Quilt:

1. Using the diagram below, lay out the A/B 4-patch blocks and 6 1/2" square C blocks to create rows of (5) blocks.
2. Set the 4-patch blocks in the same direction to create diagonal lines across the quilt.
3. Sew the blocks in each row together and press the seams in the direction indicated in the diagram.
4. Sew the (5) rows together as shown in the diagram.
5. Add the Inner Border, sewing the sides on first, then the top and bottom.
6. Add the Outer Border, sewing the sides on first, then the top and bottom.


Finished quilt top size: 38 inches x 38 inches

After Quilting:

1. Be sure to label your quilt indicating it is for Quilts of Hope NICU. Please include your first name and initial.
2. Wash the quilt in a mild, fragrance-free detergent.




