



RV Safety Tips For Women Traveling Alone

Bad things can happen anywhere, even when traveling with a man, whether at home or on the road. The best thing you can do is be prepared and always trust your instincts!

1. Always let someone know where you'll be and check in with them regularly.
2. Carry the proper equipment, such as:
 - Cellular boosters for remote areas
 - Cell phones, laptops, Nomad Air Travel Internet, etc.
 - Emergency GPS tracker if you're going very remote.
 - Bear spray
3. Don't go too far off the well-beaten path.
4. Women can invest in a large pair of men's work boots to leave by the door to act as a deterrent.
5. Travel with a dog.
6. Check-in with the camp host (if there is one).
7. Make friends with the neighbors if they look like reputable people.
8. Research the area you'll be in.
9. Always lock your doors.
10. Carry some sort of protection – even mace or an audible alarm - unpredictable wildlife are just as much of a threat as other humans.
11. Remain aware of your surroundings and know when to leave!
12. Keep the keys in an easy-to-access area when you go to bed.
13. If someone asks if you are traveling alone, say you are on your way to meet a spouse, relative or friend.
14. Consider a membership to a roadside assistance company such as AARP or AAA.

So many fun, wonderful times were had by all, and friendships that will last a lifetime.








TIPS FOR RV BEGINNERS

A lot of cooking in your RV oven will be done through trial and error. Just know you might have some disasters and that's OK. It's a good idea to have a backup plan in case dinner has to be thrown in the trash.

1. Preheat your oven. Although it feels like a waste of propane, take the few extra minutes and preheat your oven. It's important to have your oven at the right temperature so the food cooks more efficiently.

2. Use an Oven Thermometer. There is absolutely no way for you to know if your oven is actually at the right temperature without using an oven thermometer. RV oven temps on the dial are not to be trusted!

3. Use a baking stone. Place a baking stone on the bottom rack to disperse the heat. If your muffins are burnt on top and the insides didn't get done, this should solve the problem.

4. Use the Right Size Bakeware. RV ovens are small! Round up the bakeware you want to bring with you and see if they fit. Why bring a heavy, oversized dish with you that ends up being useless?

5. Raise the Wire Rack Higher. Unless you like the bottoms of your food blackened, you'll find that the middle section is just about right.

6. Rotate your dish halfway through cooking time. Some people have found that one side of their oven cooks hotter than the other. This alleviates the problem.

7. Make Sure Your RV Is Level. If your muffins or cake come out sloped, you'll know why. They'll still taste fine, but will just look funny.

8. Know That Cooking Times Will Be Different. Your RV oven will either cook slower or faster than the oven in your stationary home. Keeping notes with cooking times for each dish previously made in your RV oven helps to alleviate any stress and problems when baking.

9. Make Sure You Have Propane. I know, duh, right? But when you're first starting out, you're not used to keeping an eye on things like your propane levels.

Additional tip: If you have a favorite bread recipe (such as cinnamon raisin), instead of baking it in a loaf pan which takes about an hour (and uses tons of propane), make it into muffins which only takes minutes.

TAYLOR'S TIPS

1. If you've ever broken drinking glasses while traveling, this one is for you. Slide koozies over them and place them back in the cabinet to keep them nice and safe.

2. Protect your wine bottles while enroute with mesh sleeves. If they knock together, they won't break.

3. To save space, use a collapsible laundry basket as a wastebasket when camping. They can be collapsed between uses and stored out of the way.

4. Most people realize the benefit of keeping duct tape in their rig, but what about clothespins? They can be used for laundry, chip clips, and even securing trash bags.

5. Keep some clotheslines handy as well. You can use it to assist with laundry, hang wet towels and swimsuits, and tie cabinets closed when in transit.

6. Another option to keep cabinets closed, while traveling, is to secure them with bungee straps. The 3-inch loops with a ball end are useful for cabinet doors, and the ones with hooks on the ends are great for drawer handles.

7. Dry erase boards have many uses. Magnetic ones can be hung on the refrigerator. Along with emergency information, you can post a checklist of things to do before heading out, a grocery list, or the Wi-Fi password.

8. If you have a travel trailer or fifth wheel without electric stabilizer jacks, then you are familiar with the chore of hand cranking them up and down. An easy solution is to use a rechargeable cordless drill. Simply attach a socket extension that fits your stabilizer jacks. Plug the socket into the jacks and let the drill do all the work.

9. When leaving your rig for the day, turn off your water supply if you're using your pressurized city water connection, and if you're using your freshwater tank, turn off the water pump. Should you spring a water leak while you're gone, both of these could save you a lot of damage.

10. Propane attracts wasps. Place cut up flea collars in compartments to avoid wasp infestations.

11. Although many campgrounds do provide wireless Internet, the signal is not always strong. Improve the Wi-Fi reception in your RV with a booster.

12. Most RVs already have AC and a ceiling fan, but you'll be glad to have something portable on extra hot days. Place a portable fan anywhere in your RV to create better air circulation.

13. Use Silica Packets. Place these in tough spots that don't get enough ventilation to keep your RV free of moisture and reduce the risk for mold or mildew.



Sauteed Mushrooms and Onions

(A great accompaniment to top grilled steaks)

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 20 minutes Total Time: 30 minutes Yield: 4 servings

INGREDIENTS

- 3 tablespoons of butter
- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire Sauce (or more, to taste)
- 1 lb white button mushrooms, halved (wash and dry well)
- 1 large, sweet onion, thinly sliced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Melt the butter and heat the olive oil over medium-high heat in a large skillet. DO NOT BURN. Stir in the Worcestershire Sauce. Add your mushrooms and cook until they start to turn golden brown, approximately 5 minutes. Stir about every 1 1/2 minutes. Add the onions and cook until the edges brown and the onions become translucent; approximately 5 minutes. Continue stirring every 1 1/2 minutes.
2. In the final minute, reduce the heat to low and add the minced garlic, stirring continuously. Serve hot.

S'mores Pancakes

Chocolate chips, mini marshmallows, and crushed up graham crackers are mixed with regular pancake batter to produce the flavor of this classic campfire dessert

Prep Time: 5 minutes Cook Time: 8 minutes Total Time: 13 minutes Servings: 6 pancakes

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups premade pancake mix
- 1 1/3 cups milk
- 2 Tablespoons sugar
- 1 egg
- 3/4 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 48 mini-marshmallows
- 1/4 cup Cinnamon Graham crackers, crushed
- 1 cup of your favorite chocolate syrup, optional

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Heat a non-stick griddle/pan to medium low heat.
2. In a medium mixing bowl, combine pancake mix, milk, sugar, egg, and chocolate chips.
3. Place 1/2 cup of the batter onto the griddle/pan.
4. Take 8 mini marshmallows and place in the middle of the batter.
5. Cover marshmallows with 1/2 teaspoon of the crushed graham.
6. Cover marshmallows and graham with 2-3 Tablespoons of batter. The batter should cover all of the marshmallows.
7. Cook pancakes on each side for 2-3 minutes.
8. Top each pancake with a few drizzles of chocolate syrup, a few more marshmallows, or crushed graham, if desired.

Note: You MUST use mini marshmallows with this recipe. DO NOT use the jumbo or big ones or else you will end up with a sticky mess ... even if you cut them up. Do not use the marshmallow creme either. Stick with the minis. Also, use milk and do not substitute it with buttermilk.


