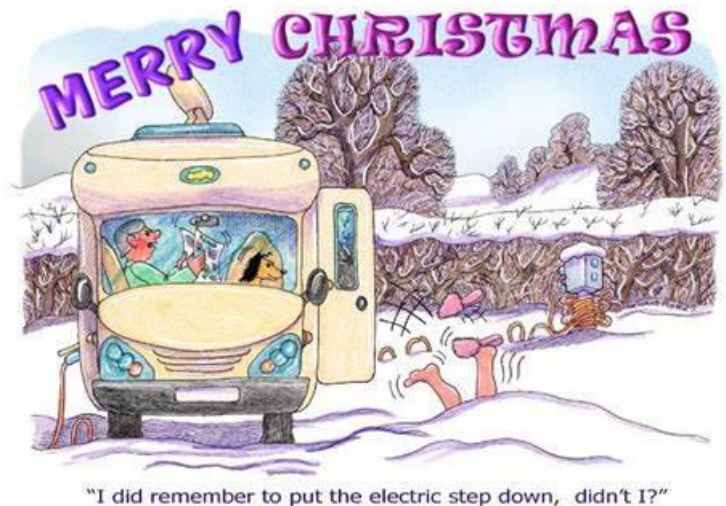

Christmas Tree Charcuterie Board

Arrange your tree using a variety of cheeses like cheddar, brie, and gouda, cutting them into cubes. Add red and green grapes, and a meat such as sliced summer sausage. The star at the top (photo right) is carved from a hard cheese, along with the stem of the tree at the bottom. This tree has an herb used as a garnish, but using small clippings of cedar is also pretty to tuck underneath (such as the board below), which uses a variety of cheeses, grapes, blueberries, kiwi and star fruit. Don't forget the toothpicks!



PUFF PASTRY HOLLY LEAVES

Prep: 30 min. Bake: 15 min. + cooling Makes 2 dozen

Ingredients

1 package (17.3 ounces) frozen puff pastry, thawed
1 large egg
1 tablespoon water
4 ounces cream cheese, softened
1 cup crumbled feta cheese
1/2 cup minced fresh parsley
1/2 cup prepared pesto
24 pimiento pieces

Directions

Unfold pastry sheets onto a lightly floured surface. From each sheet, cut out 12 leaves with a floured 3-1/2-in. leaf-shaped cookie cutter. Place on ungreased baking sheets. With a toothpick, score veins in leaves. In a small bowl, beat egg and water, brush over pastry. Bake at 400° for 12-14 minutes or until golden brown. Remove to wire racks to cool.

In a large bowl, combine the cheeses, parsley, and pesto. Slice each pastry leaf in half. Spread 1 tablespoon cheese mixture over bottom half; replace top. Add a pimiento piece on each for a holly berry.



CHRISTMAS SALAD

Prep: Total Time: 15 min. Makes 12 servings

Ingredients

9 cups torn red leaf lettuce
1 medium pear, chopped
1 medium red apple, chopped
1 small red onion, halved and sliced
1/2 cup crumbled blue cheese
1/3 cup dried cranberries
1/3 cup chopped walnuts, toasted
1/4 cup pomegranate seeds (optional)
Bottle of Raspberry Vinaigrette dressing

Directions

Assemble salad ingredients and toss well. Add dressing to taste (a little at a time is good, so that you don't drown the salad) just prior to serving.



Decorating your RV for Christmas

1. Cover Existing Throw Pillows

Place decorative camper themed Christmas throw pillow covers over existing pillows. These colorful designs provide a big punch of holiday cheer that is easily packed away and require essentially no storage space.

2. Use Decorative Kitchen Linens

Display camper Christmas themed towels, potholders, and oven mitts inside your RV. They are functional and decorative at the same time.

3. Burn Christmas Candles

It's amazing how certain scents can get you into the holiday spirit. One fragrant candle can fill an entire travel trailer with scents like fresh baked cookies, peppermint, and hot apple pie.

4. Hang String Lights Inside

Many full-time RVers don't have enough storage space to carry Christmas lights but they often have normal camping string lights they can use in the RV to make their interior glow like a glistening winter wonderland.

5. Display RV Christmas Ornaments

There are lots of ways to display fun, camping-themed RV ornaments that don't include hanging them on trees! They can be hung from drawer pulls, window cranks, key hooks, doorknobs, etc. Choose ornaments that are lightweight, non-breakable, and fit a smaller space.

6. Decorate Cabinetry & Doors

Decorate your cabinetry and doors with ribbons, bows, wreaths or freshly cut evergreen sprays. Tie cute ribbons around your doorknobs and drawer pulls. Artificial evergreen wreaths and sprays can take up too much storage space, but it is easy enough to create your own using a few sprigs from a fresh tree.

7. Decorate Windows And Mirrors

Temporary window stickers are a great way to add to your holiday theme without using any valuable living space. When you look out the window or into the mirror and see a smiling snow man, waving Santa, snowflakes falling and prancing reindeer looking back at you ... you know it's Christmas time!

8. Countertop Decorating Ideas

Set a cute small Christmas camper decoration on a prominent counter in your RV. If you don't have one that is decorated in a holiday theme, just attach a small string of tiny garland for the season.

9. Decorate A Small Tabletop Christmas Tree

Tabletop trees come in all shapes and sizes. If you don't want to haul one of these, try using another option. Rosemary plants shaped like a Christmas tree are a great option because you can cook with that fresh herb, too!

10. Christmas Doormats

One thing you always need while RVing in the winter is a good doormat. This is a great way to welcome visitors to your holiday celebration!

11. Garden Flags

Hang an outdoor Christmas camper garden flag outside your trailer. You can find Christmas-specific designs or winter themes at online sources such as Amazon.

12. Decorative Holiday Door Cover

Attaching a holiday door cover to the outside of your RV door is one of the fastest decorating ideas that provides a huge impact.

Christmas project to do with younger grandchildren

1. Purchase large felt piece in either solid green, or variation, like in the graphic below, approximately 39 inches by 27 inches (doesn't have to be exact). Cut out the tree, and glue pieces together, if necessary.
2. Purchase or use felt that you have on hand for the ornaments, preferably in different colors. Patterns for ornaments can be found on the internet, or have your grandchildren hand-draw their own. Cookie cutters can also be used as a pattern. Cut ornaments (let grandchildren do it if old enough to handle scissors) and glue on other colored pieces, if needed. Ornaments can be as elaborate, or as simple, as you'd like.
3. Felt will stick to felt, but for added stability, you can also use small pieces of velcro attached randomly to tree and on the back of the ornaments to secure them.
4. Attach tree to a backing such as a large piece of cardboard, thin plywood, etc. Set up against a wall for playtime. As an alternative, you could sew a simple rod pocket at the top to fit a lightweight dowel and hang tree on the wall by string attached to dowel.
5. Grandchildren will love to decorate their own tree, year after year.

RV storage hack for cords, cables, and hoses

What can you easily organize and store?

- Electrical cords
- Hoses
- Cables
- Wires
- Cords
- Anything else you can think of

Materials you will need:

- Screws or Self drilling screws
- D-Rings
- Velcro straps (aka hook and loop)
- Carabiners



What kind of structure is your RV made of?

Is your RV structure or interior framing made of aluminum, wood, or any other material? For aluminum, a go-to is self-drilling screws. However, if your frame is made of wood, you can use normal wood screws. Just make sure you are completely aware of how long your screws need to be. How thick is the material you are putting screws into? Is there flooring, plumbing or electrical right above? You wouldn't want to use a 2.5 inch screw for a 1 inch thick material right under your main living area. Just always be aware and be cautious. * Wood tends to crack. You may want to pre-drill your holes before drilling in your screws. If your screw measures a 1/8", don't use a drill bit bigger than 1/8". If your pre-drilled hole is bigger than your screw, the screw won't have anything to grab onto.

Where to mount?

For this kind of organization hack, it is important for this to be creative, yet super functional. For that reason, you may want to install all of these hooks on one side of the camper. The side you typically back in and hook up all of your lines to is practical to keep all of the hoses and electrical cords. Back in, open the compartment, and there lies all of your important stuff! On one side, install 4 hooks in total, two towards the front and two towards the back. Install hooks pretty close together. Doing this still allows plenty of room in the center to grab out anything else that is stored there.

- Pick the locations that best suit your needs.
- Screw in your D-ring to any super strong structure on your RV. Use plain screws or self-drilling screws.
- Neatly roll up your cords, wires, or hoses.
- Wrap the Velcro strap around whatever you just rolled up.
- Hook the carabiner through the plastic binder on the velcro strap.
- Hook your carabiner onto the D-ring.
- Step back and admire your work!

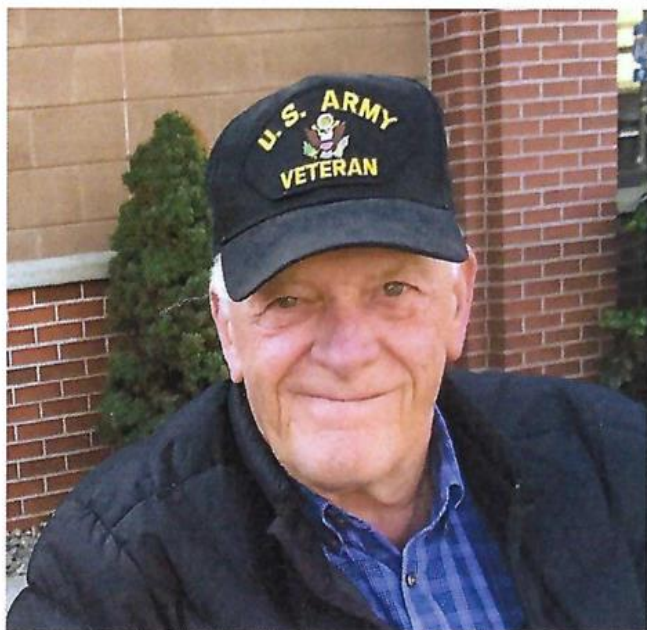
