

How to choose the best camping chair

When choosing a camping chair, consider the following factors:


- End use: For backpacking, weight and packed size are the key stats. For normal, every day camping, comfort is what matters most.
- Size/height: If you need a roomy chair, bigger is better. Low chairs are nice for concerts and uneven or sandy terrain. Taller chairs are easier to get in and out of, especially if your knees are giving you issues. Some are wider than others, if you want a chair that offers more space than an airline seat.
- Design preference: Options include classic four-legged, two-legged, three-legged, rocker, glider and more.
- Materials: Often the price reflects the quality of materials in both frame and fabrics. Don't go cheap on your chairs. As the old saying goes, you get what you pay for, and you don't want cheap fabric ripping on you. Travel chairs may include ultra-lightweight components.
- Capacity: Not all chairs can support the same weight, so check this specification if you need a stronger chair. How embarrassing it would be to have the chair collapse under you.
- Accessories: Some chairs come with a shade/canopy which may be desired in hot sun or rain. Also, some are equipped with cup holders, pockets for a cell phone, or an attached table for eating those hot dogs.










